Preferred Qualifications:

- A record of success as an educator at any educational level with experience in teaching pathology content and/or concepts.
- Experience using innovative teaching methods which might include team-based learning, 'flipped classroom', problem-based learning, distance learning, interactive large group presentation, audience response systems,
- Competency with learning management systems
- Proficiency with exam item writing (USMLE and/or COMLEX-style), and using testing software and interpreting item analysis data (e.g. Exam Soft).
- Experience with curricular and instructional design.

Specific Faculty Responsibilities:

- Approximately 60% time and effort will be devoted to the preparation and delivery of instruction in the first and second year medical student curriculum
- Work collaboratively with other faculty members to develop the integrated and interdisciplinary medical curriculum (1st and 2nd year).
- Supervise, advise, and mentor medical students through the curriculum.
