• Research Laboratories Install New Flow Cytometer We are pleased to announce the addition of a new <u>Luminex</u>

<u>Guava easyCyte Flow Cytometer</u> to the Research Laboratory inventory. The Guava easyCyte's microcapillary technology makes the instrument very compact in size and simple to operate. The instrument is capable of simultaneously measuring up to three fluorescent colors plus forward and side scatter in an automated, 96-well high-throughput capacity. This capital purchase will ensure that Burrell investigators have access to flow cytometry resources for many years to come. The Research Laboratories will receive training from Luminex on October 12 and is ready to assist Burrell investigators taking advantage of this updated capability. • Grant Submission Information

The grant submission season is upon us with a wide variety of opportunities. The Office of Research & Sponsored Programs provides the following tips to make your grant preparation and submission as smooth as possible.

- 1. Successful grant applications generally benefit from careful advance planning. Read the Request for Proposals carefully and gather all essential documents in support of your submission.
- 2. Notify ORSP of your intent to submit a proposal. The <u>Notification of Intent to Apply for Extramural Funding</u> is the mechanism for notifying ORSP. At this time you will be asked for preliminary information about the proposal including the name of the sponsor, application deadline, proposed grant period and estimated total direct cost of the proposal. This information will be used by the ORSP to notify various offices of a forthcoming grant submission.
- 3. Prepare your grant in accordance with the Sponsor requirements. Consult with ORSP regarding any questions. It is important to plan for human subjects and biosafety review if IRB and/or IBC review is needed.

- 4. The Principal Investigator/Program Director must submit a <u>Proposal Transmittal Form</u> along with all required attachments at least five (5) business days in advance of the submission deadline for routing, review and signatures. ORSP will route the submission to appropriate offices and notify the P.I./P.D. when the review process is complete. Proposals shall not be submitted without proper approvals.
- 5. The P.I./P.D. submits a complete and final copy of all submitted material to ORSP upon submission of the grant. These documents will be kept on file in the Research Office.
