Tuition and Estimated Cost of Attendance**

The *Students' Estimated Cost of Attendance (COA)* or the Student Budget is established annually, early in the year, for each class and is used to determine a student's maximum financial aid eligibility for an academic year. For financial aid purposes, the Cost of Attendance (COA) is an estimate of the total cost to attend The College and includes both direct (required) and indirect costs. In accordance with regulations governing student aid programs, a student's total financial aid package, including loans, should not exceed the estimated cost of attendance. Figures are subject to change without notice.

**Direct Costs-** The College Tuition, The College Student Fees are the direct costs billed to the student, The College Tuition includes academic learning resources. The costs are listed and are based upon full-time attendance during the academic year, Student Accounts <https://TheCollegenm.org/students/bursars-office/>. Figures are subject to change without notice.

**Indirect Costs-** other COA components are education-related expenses and are estimates. These components are included to determine student eligibility for financial aid and to help a student estimate the cost of while enrolled at the college.

1 Living expenses (housing and meals) expenses reflect the average costs of living on or off campus. Because federal regulations do not allow housing costs to be tailored to individual students, a student's personal housing arrangements do not affect the cost of attendance used by the Office of Financial Aid

2 Miscellaneous and personal expenses component is an allowance for items such as utilities, clothing, personal care products, vision/dental insurance, laundry, and other incidentals.

3 Transportation allowance includes the cost of travel between the student's residence and the institution, and the necessary travel to complete a course of study, including clinical rotations. An additional travel allowance for residency interviews and clinical rotation travel is included in the estimated cost-of-attendance."

4 Exam fees include COMLEX Level I, COMLEX Level II- CE. USLME, although recommended, not a graduation requirement, and will be considered in the cost of attendance. COMLEX Fees updated annually on July 1.

5 \$4,200 (\$350.00 per month for the 12-month enrollment period). Based on non-smoker, Florida resident per the NCSL Health Insurance Marketplace. If purchasing health insurance exceeds the average identified by THE COLLEGE, the cost-of attendance can be updated to reflect the actual direct cost billed to the student.

6 The total cost-of-attendance cannot be tailored to an individual student's quality of life, but the Office of Financial aid will do professional judgements for students with extenuating circumstances and approved elective clinical rotations that need additional travel expenses.
