The year 2024 has been transformative for Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine, marked by significant achievements that underscore our commitment to excellence in medical education and community engagement.






Burrell College faculty are deeply committed to supporting student doctors through hands-on instruction, mentorship, and collaborative learning opportunities that foster academic and professional growth.



- Students volunteered for multiple food and clothing drives for the community
- Students provided health Screenings at several community health fairs throughout the year in the Las Cruces community, including City Hall, Raices de Saber Xinachtli Community School and other community venues

- Students hosted a 5k fun run for the community, distributing materials to help educate the community an cancer awareness and preventative health.
- Multiple students helped train attendees during the STOP THE BLEED® Interactive Course. Attendees learned three quick techniques to help save a life before someone bleeds out.
- Student organizations hosted elementary, middle, and high school students from the area, providing an introduction to medicine, providing campus tours, and demonstrations.
- Students partnered with Vitalant to host a blood drive on the Burrell campus.





FLORIDA CAMPUS

In July 2024, Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine welcomed 108 new student doctors at the official opening of its Florida campus, marked by a special ribbon-cutting ceremony. Located on the campus of the Florida Institute of Technology, our new site began its journey under the leadership of Campus Dean Dr. Doris Newman. Since opening, the Florida campus has quickly become an integral part of the region's healthcare landscape—training future physicians, building strong partnerships with local hospitals and clinics, and addressing the growing healthcare needs of Florida's Space Coast.

CLASS OF 2024:

Our Class of 2024 was matched across the country in competitive residencies, where they will begin the next chapter of their medical journey as practicing physicians.

- 78 physicians will train in one of the primary care specialties, which includes family medicine, internal medicine, and pediatrics.
- 13 graduating physicians are practicing emergency medicine, working at the forefront of healthcare in emergency rooms and departments.
- 28 physicians will pursue residency training in the Burrell College's mission region states of New Mexico, Texas, Arizona and Florida.
- 30 graduating physicians are training in family medicine, a physician specialty that is critically underserved in the U.S.



- 144 graduates in the Class of 2024 were offered employment in 18 specialties across the United States.
